Judicial Internship—Summer 2025

Judge Laroski will be hiring two full-time judicial interns for summer 2025. The positions will be unpaid and require interns to work in-person in Manhattan. Please note that per Court policy, interns must be citizens of the United States. The Court

The US Court of International Trade, established by Congress pursuant to Article III of the US Constitution, hears a unique docket of cases concerning the customs and international trade laws of the United States. In particular, the Court's work deals with litigation arising from the customs and trade remedy enforcement activity of the US International Trade Commission, the US Department of Commerce, and US Customs and Border Protection. Correspondingly, the Court's docket involves both trial and quasi-appellate matters. In addition, judges on the Court routinely sit by designation alongside colleagues on US District Courts and Courts of Appeals, providing chambers staff with exposure to federal courts practice more broadly.

The Position

Interns will assist Judge Laroski and his term law clerks on all aspects of chambers business, including issuing orders, analyzing party submissions, preparing for oral argument, and drafting opinions. As a result, interns will have ample opportunity to do meaningful legal research and analysis, generate written work of their own, and attend court proceedings and more informal educational and social events.

The Application

Each application should include the following information:

1. A **one-page cover letter** that provides us with a brief introduction to you, your interests, and how the internship aligns with your interests. Please include contact information for **two references** who can speak to qualities you have demonstrated in a recent academic or professional experience.
2. A **one-page resume** that includes any notable professional or extracurricular experiences.
3. Any law school, graduate, and/or undergraduate **transcripts**, which may be shared in unofficial form.
4. A representative **writing sample** from your first semester of law school.

Interviews will be conducted via Teams on a rolling basis. Only those candidates who receive interviews will be notified. Thank you for your interest!
